

#### **Spotlight on attendance**



Unfortunately, we have had several cases of chickenpox in the last couple of weeks that has impacted on our attendance.

Chickenpox is a highly contagious infection that causes an itchy, spotty rash. If your child gets chickenpox, it is nothing to worry about, but they must stay off school until all the spots have formed a scab. This is usually 5 days after the spots first appear but can on occasion be a little longer.
