Year 2 Visit to the Coventry Transport Museum








Harvest Festival

It is a legal responsibility of parents to ensure their child attends school every day it is open unless there is a valid reason for them not to do so.

At school we work hard to support all our families with attendance. However, where children do not have good attendance and there is no good reason for this, parents may face a penalty notice for irregular attendance, or even be referred to court where they could receive both a fine and a criminal record. The penalty notice fine per child is £160 for each parent.
