## **Spotlight on Attendance**

#### Some interesting facts and information relating to attendance.

- All schools must report their termly attendance percentages to the Local Authority.
- · If your child is not in school s/he does not reach her/his learning potential.
- · Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child receives a full-time education.
- Parents can be issued with Fixed Penalty Notices (fines) for failing to ensure that their child attends school regularly- this includes taking children out of school on holiday, and excess 'lates'.
- The Local Authority has the power to prosecute parents in the Magistrates Court for the offence of failing to ensure their child attends school regularly.
- · If your child arrives after 9:30am we are required to mark them as having unauthorised absence for the whole morning arriving after 9:30am once in a week brings their attendance down to 90% for that week.
