#### Some of our learning this week

# **Spotlight on Attendance**

We have started to have leave in term time request forms come in from families for holidays at the end of this term, but also for the beginning of the new school year in September. Please remember that taking your children out of school for a holiday is not permitted and the absence will be unauthorised.

We also have an obligation to notify the local authority of any leave in term time taken by families and from August 2024, the fine for school absences across the country will be £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days.

In the case of repeated fines, if a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160.

If you're prosecuted and attend court because your child hasn't been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500.

Money raised via fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. It does not go to the school. Any extra money is returned to the government.
