

Makaton

Makaton signs of the week.



As a school, we have been learning to use Makaton signs. Makaton is a language programme that combines signs, symbols and speech to give different options for people to communicate. It is designed to support the development of spoken language, as using signs can help people who have no speech or whose speech is unclear. Every week we will learn different signs, and these will feature on our newsletter. Ask your child what signs we have been learning every week to see if they can remember them. Here are the signs and symbols for next week.
